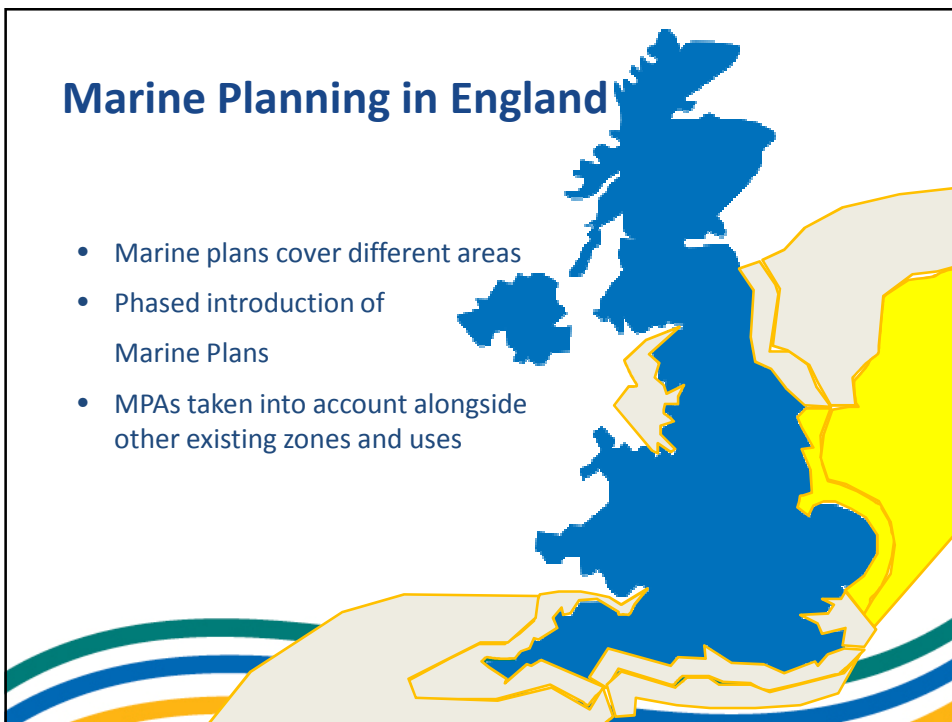
How we expect to use our tools
